West Hills Century Cycling Event This year will mark the introduction of a new full Century route in addition to sister routes measuring 62 miles, 38 miles and 10 miles. As in the past, all routes will start and end on the campus of West Hills College in Coalinga. Since its inception in 2014, this event has been a joint effort of the Fresno Cycling Club and West Hills College Coalinga, and has quickly become recognized as a "true partnership."

According to ride coordinator and West Hills College Instructor, Al Graves, "This year the College and the Club will introduce an 'enhanced partnership'." Graves explained, "West Hills College will again host the event and provide volunteers, while the cycling club will encourage participation and provide SAG support." Graves added, "After deducting the cost of the after ride meal, all funds collected from registration will be split 50:50 with the Club." According to Club President, Dennis Ball, "If we can attract 200 riders, almost \$3,000 could be added to the Club's coffers. This would be good for the Club. We can use all the financial help we can get." College president, Dr. Carole Goldsmith, noted, "All of the College's profits will go to student programs—particularly our 'President's Scholars' program."

The event will be held on **March 12** (more information to follow). Thanks to the West Hills Century Coordination Committee, ASB Officers, Tom Wixon and Alex Villalobos for working together to make this happen.



West Hills College Coalinga was pleased to offer Word for Windows 2013 (Business 13 A/B) class this spring at the San Joaquin Center. The class is designed to teach students the basic and advance features of Word for Windows for fundamental use in an office or for personal use.

Mr. Cecilio Mora, Coordinator of Special Grants, leads the Fresno Regional Workforce Connection team who worked with Student Services and community members to conduct interest surveys and outreach.

"Currently, there are 21 adult working students who are attending this class, 19 students reside in the City of San Joaquin and two travel from Kerman. All of the students are

highly motivated and eager to learn" shared Mr. Mora (pictured) is also the adjunct instructor for the course.

Thank you to the collaboration efforts of community leaders and WHCC staff West Hills College Coalinga was able to surpass the enrollment goal. Based on the feedback received from students, they are looking forward to taking other classes at the San Joaquin Center in the future.

Wonderful West Hills Ag Academy @Avenal High School

The California Career Pathways Trust (CCPT 1) Ag Pathway is in its sixth semester. There are currently 117 students that are dual-enrolled, 53 sophomores and 64 freshmen. By the end of spring 2016 most of the sophomores will have completed 18 units of transferable college credit and are on-track to achieve their associate degrees the summer after their high school graduation (2018). This is a win-win for all involved, we started with CCPT1 offering the courses as contract education and for the first time, this spring, the courses are generating FTES. Special thanks to Coach Wright for teaching Health Education and Travis Blackstock for teaching Tractor Operation.

WORKFORCE CONNECTION

Yvonne Lopez was recently recognized by the Fresno Regional Investment Board with the *Outstanding Achievement Award*. Ms. Lopez decided to pursue the Psychiatric Training on 2014. Prior to enrolling in Psychiatric Technician, Ms. Lopez depended on public assistance and her part time as an In-Home Supportive Service Aide. Ms. Lopez decided that she needed to go back to school in order to better provide for her family, and to set an example to her children. Ms. Lopez heard about West Hills College making a difference in people's lives. She felt that with her skills as a CNA and In-Home Supportive Service, Psych Tech was the career she needed. Ms. Lopez went to the college's Workforce Connection and CalWORKs program for help and she became fully sponsored for the Psychiatric Technician program.



Ms. Lopez graduated from the Psychiatric Technician program with an overall GPA of 3.3, while working on weekends, raising her children, and maintaining her household. She started working at Coalinga State Hospital on October, 2015 as a Licensed Psychiatric Technician full time with benefits and annual estimated salary of \$52,000.

Ms. Lopez has set a wonderful example to her family - hard work, setting obtaining goals, and perseverance has paid off. Her motivation, determination, and willingness to succeed in life, in combination with the staff at Workforce Connection, and CalWORKs along with WHCC Faculty have assisted her in accomplishing her goals of becoming self-sufficient and a Licensed Psychiatric Technician. **You are Falcon strong! Scholarship materials have now been posted for the 2016-2017 school year. There are a number of major changes. President's Scholars (starting with freshmen in the fall of 2016) will be required to enroll and complete 15 units per semester to qualify.
