The CalWORKs staff hosted a West Hills Community College and Department of Social Services Roundtable meeting (DSS) at WHC campus on October 21. Dr. Bertha Felix-Mata and Gabriel Silvestre co-chair the meetings designed to strengthen the relationships between various services department at DSS and the West Hills Community College Coalinga CalWORKs program.
